

## **Funding Opportunity for Ph. D. Students Researching Politics or Economics**

Thanks to a generous grant from the Carnegie Corporation of New York, the Harriman Institute at Columbia University announces a competition to provide funding for travel and expenses for up to ten Ph.D. students to attend the EACES-HSE Workshop: "Topics in Political Economy of Development: Historical and Contemporary Factors," June 7-9, 2018 in Moscow.

The International Center for the Study of Institutions and Development (ICSID) at Higher School of Economics in Moscow together with the European Association for Comparative Economic Studies (EACES) are pleased to invite submissions to the workshop: Topics in Political Economy of Development. The workshop is a part of the 7th Annual ICSID Conference "Political Economy of Development: Historical and Contemporary Factors" that will take place at the Higher School of Economics in Moscow on **June 7-9, 2018** (information on the last year's conference see [here](#)).

Contributions from the fields of political economy and political science are invited. We welcome submissions that can offer useful perspectives on recent developments and new challenges in political economy as well as those that offer historical and comparative perspective. The working language for the workshop is English. The workshop will be held in the central HSE campus at Myasnitskaya st., 20, Moscow. Research topics need not focus on Russia.

### **Submission:**

To participate in the workshop, please submit a paper abstract of up to 250 words (or a draft), together with a short CV, to Professor Andrei Yakovlev to [ayakovlev@hse.ru](mailto:ayakovlev@hse.ru) by **February 20th, 2017**. Applicants will be informed about their selection by **March 6th**, and the authors of accepted proposals are expected to submit full papers by **May 15th**.

Once you have received an acceptance to the workshop, please send a c. v. and abstract to Timothy Frye, [tmf2@columbia.edu](mailto:tmf2@columbia.edu) by March 13. Decisions about funding for the workshop will be made by **March 20<sup>th</sup>**. We expect to provide up to 10 grants for \$2250.

ICSID will provide you with an invitation necessary to apply for a visa at a Russian consulate of your choosing. Since issuing an invitation for a visa may take up to 4 weeks we would be grateful if you could apply in advance.

ICSID can also assist in finding accommodation at one of the HSE Guest Houses or hotels during your stay in Moscow. Please note that HSE Guest House room availability is not guaranteed, therefore early requests are appreciated.
