

**Oleh Wolowyna** was born in Lviv, Ukraine, and grew up in Argentina. He has a Licenciado degree in mathematics from the National University of Buenos Aires, Masters in Sociology and Statistics from the Univ. of Florida in Gainesville, Ph. D. in demography from Brown University, and was a postdoctoral fellow at the University of Wisconsin in Madison. He has taught at the University of Florida, Western Ontario, and North Carolina Chapel Hill. He is a Fellow at the Center for Slavic, Eurasian and Eastern European Studies at the University of North Carolina and a two-time recipient of a Fulbright Scholar grant. He is working on the demography of the 1932-1934 Famine in Ukraine and Russia with a team of demographers at the Ptukha Institute of Demography and Social Studies of the National Academy of Sciences of Ukraine. Their recent article on 1932-1934 famine losses in Ukraine and Russia received the ASN Huttenbach Prize for the best article published in the journal "Nationalities Papers" in 2020. He is a full member of the Shevchenko Scientific Society and the founder and Director of its Center for Demographic and Socioeconomic Research on Ukrainians in the United States. His latest publication is *Atlas of Ukrainians in the U.S.* He is also Vice-president of the Ukrainian Association of North Carolina.
