

Robert H. Davis, Jr., is Librarian for Russian, Eurasian and East European Collections at Columbia University, where he is principally responsible for the curatorship of one of North America's oldest, largest, and most distinguished area studies collections, encompassing more than sixty languages of Eastern Europe and the former Soviet Union. Since 2010, he has also served as Slavic & East European Studies Librarian at Cornell University, overseeing another of the largest Russian and East European vernacular collections in North America. He is past Chair of the thirteen-member East Coast Consortium of Slavic Library Collections. He holds an undergraduate degree from Columbia College of Columbia University, a degree in history from Columbia's Graduate School of Arts & Sciences, a certificate in Russian Studies from Columbia's Harriman Institute, and a second master's degree in library science from the City University of New York, where he was elected to Beta Phi Mu. Author of five books, and many articles, reviews, and communications, Mr. Davis has presented referred conference papers at numerous regional, national, and international meetings. He has also authored, coauthored, and/or managed ten preservation and access grants funded by various federal and private entities, including the National Endowment for the Humanities and the Department of Education.
