

Sergei I. Zhuk is Professor of History at Ball State University, Indiana, USA. A former Soviet expert in US history, he moved in 1997 to the United States, defended his American Ph.D. dissertation about imperial Russian history at Johns Hopkins University in 2002. His research interests are international relations (especially US-Russia-Ukraine relations), knowledge production, cultural consumption, religion, popular culture, and identity in a history of the United States, imperial Russia, Ukraine and the Soviet Union. His recent publications include *Soviet Americana: The Cultural History of Russian and Ukrainian Americanists* (2018), *Nikolai Bolkhovitinov and American Studies in the USSR: People's Diplomacy in the Cold War* (2017), and *Rock and Roll in the Rocket City: The West, Identity, and Ideology in Soviet Dnepropetrovsk, 1960-1985* (2010). His recent book is about the KGB special operations against the US and Canada in Soviet Ukraine, 1953-1991 (2022).
