

Simone Attilio Bellezza is tenure-track Assistant Professor of Modern History at the Department of Social Sciences of the University of Naples Federico II. The fil rouge of his work is the study of national belonging and its relationship with other kinds of loyalty (social, political, cultural, and religious). He has held visiting positions at the Harvard Ukrainian Research Institute (2008 and 2019), Centre for Advanced Study of Sofia (2014), Harriman Institute of Columbia University (2016), University of Toronto (2017), Monash University (2018). His book [The Shore of Expectations: A Study on the Culture of the Ukrainian Shistdesiatnyky](#) (CIUS Press, 2019) received the Omeljan Pritsak Book Prize in Ukrainian Studies awarded by ASEES. Within the project PRIN 2017 Inventing the Global Environment (www.inveglement.eu) he is currently working on a research whose first objective is to investigate, through the study of the Ukrainian case, the importance of the relationship between diaspora communities and their original homeland in the emergence of the movements for the defense of human rights and the defense of the environment.
