Matthew D. Pauly is an Associate Professor of History at Michigan State University. He is a core faculty member of the Center for European, Russian, and Eurasian Studies at MSU and an affiliate faculty member of the Michael and Elaine Serling Institute for Jewish Studies and Modern Israel. He is the author of *Breaking the Tongue: Language, Education, and Power in Soviet Ukraine* (University of Toronto Press) as well as numerous journal articles and book chapters on early Soviet nationalities policy, education, and childhood in the Russian Empire and Soviet Ukraine. He has won grants for his research from the US Fulbright Program, the International Research & Exchanges Board, the American Councils for International Education, the Shevchenko Scientific Society, and the Canadian Foundation for Ukrainian Studies. Dr. Pauly is currently engaged in the writing of two books: a research monograph, "City of Children: Juvenile Poverty, Crime, and Salvation in Odesa," and a historical survey, "Traversing Europe," that prominently integrates Ukraine into the twentieth-century history of the continent.
